- Provide professional speaker assistance for franchisor presenters.

## During event, your professional host will...

- Add appropriate humor in just the right places to help audience stay engaged
- Create a consistent voice that adds a sense of familiarity, connection & community something that can get lost in a disorganized virtual event
- Introduce and create excitement for each speaker
- Recap and give context to each sessions' key points
- Deliver important housekeeping notes
- Control flow and timing to ensure the schedule stays intact
- Manage energy: This is a science—to bring energy up or bring energy down to let people breathe, as necessary.
- Handle all aspects of the interweaving portions of your event to leave your executive and event team to do what they do best.
- Save the day, when/if needed. (This is <u>especially</u> important as we navigate the waters of virtual event technology)
